Subscription Notice for Draft Agenda Items

In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003; 505 Van Ness Avenue; San Francisco, CA 94102; or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

In addition, the Commission will make draft agenda items available for viewing and photocopying (at 20 cents per page) at the Commission's Central Files Office (Room 2002), 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, and in the Los Angeles, San Diego, and the following field offices: El Centro, Eureka, Sacramento and San Bernardino. Since the agenda package will be mailed to these locations, it will be available at these locations a day or two after the distribution date. These locations will not receive agenda items that are not ready on the distribution date.

If an agenda item is held over to a subsequent Commission meeting, that agenda item and any revisions to that agenda item that were available on the morning of the initial Commission meeting (as well as any further available revisions) will be mailed in the Escutia package for the subsequent Commission meeting; the item and its revisions will also be available for viewing and photocopying in the Commission's Central Files Office and field offices as set forth above.

Draft Resolution Approving Disclosure Of Information Concerning Utility Readiness With Respect To The Year 2000 Computer Problem, Including Utility Responses to Resolution M-4792, Dated November 19, 1998 Available For Public Review And Comment.

A draft resolution (M-4793) of the Executive Division approving disclosure of information concerning utility readiness with respect to the Year 2000 (Y2K) computer problem, including utility responses to resolution M-4792, dated November 19, 1998, will be on the April 1, 1999 Commission meeting agenda. The Commission may vote on this resolution at that time, or it may postpone a vote until later. When the Commission votes on M-4793, it may adopt all or part of it as written, amend or modify it, or set it aside and prepare a different resolution.

The draft resolution was circulated on March 2, 1999 to the Resolution M-4792 Service List, and to other entities, such as certain passenger stage corporations and vessel common carriers, who have been asked to provide information concerning their Y2K readiness.

Utilities and other entities providing Y2K readiness reports to the Commission pursuant to Resolution M-4792 may request in comments to this draft resolution that certain limited portions of their Y2K readiness reports should be treated as confidential. Entities seeking confidential treatment should recognize the strong public interest in disclosure of Y2K readiness information, and should seek confidential treatment only if they can demonstrate to the Commission's satisfaction both that the portions they wish kept confidential fall within a specific exemption in the California Public Records Act (Government Code Section 6250 et seq.) and that the public interest in nondisclosure clearly outweighs the public interest in disclosure. An entity should not seek confidential treatment of any information which has been made publicly available through Y2K readiness reports filed by that entity with other agencies or through reports posted on the entity's web site. Any request for confidentiality must be filed prior to the close of the comment period for this resolution.

Summary: On March 2, 1999, Pacific Gas & Electric Co. (“PG&E”) initiated three (3) consecutive meetings with PUC officials. Jana Corey, Thomas Bottorff, and David Rubin of PG&E met with (a) Commission President Bilas and his advisor, Dorothy Duda, (b) Michelle Cooke, advisor to Commissioner Duque, and (c) Commissioner Neeper and his advisor, David Gamson. The oral ex parte communication was the same in each meeting. Ms Corey stated PG&E believes the Commission should adopt now a revenue sharing mechanism for PG&E’s new non-tariffed products and services. The further negotiation period required by the administrative law judge’s proposed decision will not likely bear fruit, she said, resulting in delay. Mr. Rubin stated PG&E’s after-tax net revenue sharing mechanism provides appropriate incentives, is consistent with economic principles, protects the ratepayer, and maximizes efficiency of PG&E’s assets. Mr. Rubin provided additional details on why PUC should adopt that mechanism. In reference to the Office of Ratepayer Advocates’ (“ORA”) support for the Edison/ORA memorandum of understanding in Edison’s revenue sharing case, Ms Corey said that PG&E’s situation is different than Edison’s. She said PG&E would apply for a permanent mechanism after the Commission rules on their distribution performance based ratemaking (“PBR”) mechanism. Also, she said, PG&E’s revenue sharing mechanism is applied only to new non-tariffed products and services. Mr. Rubin concluded by saying PG&E requests pricing flexibility be included in the conclusions of law and certain other uncontested issues, which he named.
