Related arguments were presented before the Edison representative concluded that there is no reason to consolidate the rate design applications for the three (3) utilities and that doing so in the new competitive market context could have anti-competitive consequences. A more detailed summary of these points was provided in writing to Ms Duda, a copy of which was attached to the filer's Notice of Ex Parte Communications.
