**Summary:** On April 15, 1999, James Weil representing himself, The Utility Reform Network ("TURN"), and the Utility Consumers Action Network ("UCAN"), attended an "all party" meeting at the invitation of Commissioner Duque and conveyed oral

communications to him therein at this CPUC gathering. Other parties reported in attendance were San Diego Gas & Electric Co., Southern California Edison ("SCE"), Pacific Gas & Electric Co., Office of Ratepayer Advocates, and individuals Ron Knecht and Ray Czahar. Mr. Weil opined that citation of generation risks in the proposed decision ("PD") of the ALJ and the alternate decision ("AD") of Commissioner Duque to justify the recommended ROE ("return on equity") is contrary to Bluefield and the concept of unbundling costs of capital.
