Summary: On April 20, 1999 NEXTLINK California ("NextLink") urged Commission President Bilas not to adopt new reporting requirements for addressing "slamming" and "cramming" issues that would be expensive for small competitive local exchange carriers ("CLEC") and imperil their ability to compete in the marketplace. NextLink representatives Karen M. Potkuk, Melissa Waksman, and Nick Selby initiated the ex parte encounter at CPUCin regard to the pending draft decision of the administrative law judge. Mr. Selby is outside counsel for the ICG Telecom Group, Inc. ("ICG") as well as for NextLink. Ms Potkuk also urged PUC to preserve carriers' authorization to disconnect service when valid charges have not been paid and are not disputed by the customer. She contrasted the time consuming tasks of migrating customers from incumbent local exchange carriers ("ILEC's") from the automatic process by which primary interexchange carriers ("PIC") are accomplished for interexchange carriers ("IEC's"). Further details were cited why NextLink cannot accept a proposed requirement for addressing the "sliding" problem that would require CLEC's to migrate customers within 30 days of an executed letter of authorization ("LOA"). Mr. Selby said if the Commission placed a time limit within which an LOA remains valid for migration of local exchange service, it should be at least one year. Summary: On April 20, 1999 Russell G. Worden of Southern California Edison Co. ("Edison) telephoned David Gamson to tell him Edison had met with representatives of Riverside County ("County") and the Colmac project in an effort to work out differences. Mr. Gamson is an advisor to Commissioner Neeper. Mr. Worden said an analysis of the California Integrated Waste Management Board on a potential Colmac shutdown concluded the effect would not be as substantial as that initially claimed by the County. Citing papers filed in this proceeding by the County, Mr. Worden indicated those papers indicted the worst case effect of a shutdown was only "4-6 percent." The Edison representative expressed hope the Commission would not feel obligated to compel a lengthy environmental impact report on this qualifying facility ("QF") contract amendment. Mr. Worden asserted the Colmac application has ratepayer benefits of \$60 million and that Edison customers should not be forced to continue paying above market rates. The problem, he said, was between the facility's owner and the County. Mr. Worden ended the communication by stating Edison customers in such places as Ventura and Compton should not be forced to subsidize the County's solid waste compliance requirements through above market energy rates.

Summary: On April 21, 1999 the Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA") told Michelle Cooke they together with TURN ("The Utility Reform Network") were requesting a 90 day deferral of hearings. Ms Cooke is an advisor to Commissioner Duque. The ORA representative, James Scarff, added that other parties (and he named them) that he contacted either supported or did not oppose the deferral. Mr. Scharff cited the Legislature's schedule hearing on the question of AB 1890 and hydroelectric assets as justification for the deferral. Bruce Foster of Southern California Edison attended the meeting and, along with Mr. Scarff, jointly initiated it. Mr. Scharff offered that Edison had been discussing means of valuation of its hydroelectric system should that system remain within the Utility Distribution Company.
