Mr. McCallion said the Motion to Compel approved discovery on status quo matters whereas the Scoping Memo stated the proceeding was to focus on the effects of the merger. Mr. McCallion stated discovery outside the issues in the Scoping Memo diverts attention and resources relating to the merger. He concluded by urging that excessive burdens on the applicants and further delays in the proceeding be avoided. This meeting at CPUC was initiated by GTE. No written materials were used.

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
