In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003, 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, CA 94102, or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

In addition, the Commission will make draft agenda items available for viewing and photocopying (at 20 cents per page) at the Commission's Central Files Office (Room 2002), 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, and in the Los Angeles, San Diego, and the following field offices: El Centro, Eureka, Sacramento and San Bernardino. These locations will not receive agenda items that are not ready on the distribution date.

("Edison") told Commission President Bilas the proposed decision ("PD") should be modified to correct findings associated with recovery of Santa Catalina Island diesel fuel and Devers Palo Verde 2 ("DPV2") abandoned plant costs. Due to its geographic isolation from the Power Exchange, Edison stated, the island's generation assets are not uneconomic costs in the context of § 367. Fuel costs, therefore, should not be treated as "going forward" costs according to Edison. Edison then pointed out the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission never stated that DPV2 costs were unreasonable, and that D97-05-081 allowed Edison to record the full \$6.7 million of DPV2 abandoned plant costs to the Electric Revenue Adjustment Mechanism Balancing Account. Edison concluding by stating the PD properly adopted an avoided cost methodology for the calculation of the PX credit, and gave reasons for their view. The Edison representatives involved were Mike Hoover, John Hughes, and Akbar Jazayeri. An ex parte writing was provided President Bilas. It was a single briefing sheet entitled "Revenue Adjustment Proceeding." Among the items listed on the sheet was the entry "Santa Catalina Island Diesel Fuel Costs." The meeting with President Bilas was initiated by the utility.

Summary: On May 14, 1999 Pac-West Telecomm, Inc. ("Pac-West") representatives initiated a noon meeting at Kites restaurant in San Francisco with Fassil Fenikile, advisor to commissioner Neeper. Attorneys James Tobin and Mary Wand told Mr. Fenikile that the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") order in Docket 96-98 does not prohibit states from requiring reciprocal compensation for Internet traffic. Moreover, Mr. Tobin added, the Commission should not decide industry wide policy matters in an arbitration proceeding where numerous parties interested in the outcome are not permitted to participate. Mr. Tobin stated the Final Arbitrator's Report correctly concludes the arbitration should "stay the course" and deal with the reciprocal compensation issue only when all interested parties are able to participate. Mary Wand said Pacific Bell's proposal for meet point billing of calls to the Internet is not detailed in the arbitration record, and

that existing meet point billing arrangements for carrier access and dedicated services cannot be applied to Internet calls. Ms Wand concluded by indicating the Commission should not adopt meet point billing unless Pac-West is first afforded an opportunity to review and comment upon any such proposal.
