Summary: On June 1, 1999, the President of the California Association of Competitive Telecommunications Companies ("CalTel") wrote a letter to Commission President Bilas and Commissioner Duque. Katherine Stokes Morehouse expressed her organization's "unqualified support for the rights of CLEC's to received reciprocal compensation." She went on to state that this highly contentious proceeding should be decided in a full proceeding, and that Commissioner Neeper's alternative proposed decision is inconsistent with the Telecommunication Act of 1996. Ms Morehouse's letter concluded by stating the alternative provides no direction to parties desiring to establish agreements, and that the issue is important in the future for rural Internet users.

Summary: On June 1, 1999 Pacific Bell ("PacBell") told Tim Sullivan the UNE prices in the proposed decision are so low it will harm investment and distort the development of

competition in California. PacBell representatives conveying that to Mr. Sullivan, advisor to Commissioner Duque, were Lvnn Mowery, Tim Dawson, and Ron Sawyer. The ex parte meeting held at CPUC was initiated by PacBell. Other assertions made by PacBell were as follows. The proposed prices cannot be sustained and simply encourage CLEC's to buy UNE's and arbitrage PacBell's existing price structure using the utility's assets. PacBell provided written ex parte material showing that UNE prices compared to existing prices have discounts from 34% for an average business customer to 87% for residential call waiting. PacBell said the UNE transport proposed prices are inconsistent with the draft decision's findings that transport is competitive and widely available in California. The proposed UNE prices will allow competitors to serve the residential market using UNE's. CLEC's claiming otherwise are ignoring that basic service represents only a small portion of the customer's bill and that total customer billings must be considered. PacBell loop price is one of the lowest in the nation and the statewide UNE price for a loop and port is as low as the urban price in New York and Texas. Giving CLEC's a residential loop USF credit improperly gives CLEC's the benefits of USF funding without requiring them to assume any obligations. CLEC's that require end users to subscribe to their toll service or that charge a monthly \$3.00 minimum for toll whether or not the customer makes a toll call are not carriers of last resort and are not eligible for USF funding. The written handout provided Mr. Sullivan was eight (8) pages. Four (4) of the pages were titled "Preliminary List of Errors in the Draft Decision Identified by Pacific."
