Walker explained how the PD's adoption of contribution imputation fails to acknowledge that the Commission was compelled to use contribution imputation in the Implementation Rate Design proceeding due to deficiencies in the cost studies submitted there. Finally, Walker noted that the PD acknowledges the need to recover volume insensitive costs but fails to adopt an adequate solution.
