The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items

only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. **Summary:** On July 21, 1999, Steven B. Abbott, representing Eastern Municipal Water District (District), met with Cmmr. Duque in San Francisco. Also present were: Timothy Sullivan, advisor to Cmmr. Duque; and Gregory Bowling, representative of the District.

Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. Representatives of the District stated that the District was willing and able to provide water service to the proposed development. The District representatives expressed its concern that it would have to take over the provision of water service to the development at a later date if the Mc Canna Ranch Water Company (Applicant) proved to be unviable, and noted that it had already taken over the provision of water service to two other entities. The District representatives noted that while the District's rates appeared to be higher than the Applicant's proposed rates, it was not clear that the Applicant would be financially viable given its proposed rate structure. Abbott and Bowling pointed out that the guarantee of Applicant's parent would disappear if the Applicant were sold, and that the operating contract with the Dominguez Water Company was only a memorandum of understanding for a period of three years.

Summary: On July 20, 1999, Lisa Hubbard, Director of State Regulatory Relations for Sempra Energy (Sempra), sent a letter (attached to the notice) to Cmmr. Bilas. Copies of the letter were also sent to Cmmrs. Duque, Hyatt, Neeper, and Wood; Kim Malcolm, advisor to Cmmr. Hyatt; Michelle Cooke, advisor to Cmmr Duque; Dorothy Duda and Julie Halligan, advisors to Cmmr. Bilas; David Gamson, advisor to Cmmr. Neeper; Kevin Coughlan, interim advisor to Cmmr. Wood; Executive Director Wesley Franklin; and Director Paul Clanon of the Energy Division. The letter says that since SDG&E has lifted the rate freeze, and will no longer collect CTC revenues from its customers on a residual basis, this headroom calculation is no longer an issue for SDG&E. The letter further says that pending issues regarding the status of the Transition Cost Balancing Account and the Rate Group Transition Cost Obligation Memorandum Account are being addressed in other proceedings.

Summary: On July 19, 1999, Jim Callaway, President, Pacific Telesis Group (Pacific), met with Cmmr. Wood in San Francisco. Also present were: Norman Low, interim advisor to Cmmr. Wood; Bill Blase, Vice President Regulatory, Pacific Bell (PacBell) and Dan McCarthy, Senior Counsel of Pacific. Blase expressed concern with the § 314.5 audit that the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) propose to conduct. McCarthy noted examples within the Proposal to Perform a Regulatory Audit of Pacific Bell prepared by the selected bidder, Overland Consulting (Overland), which demonstrated that the planned audit goes well beyond the guidelines provided by D96-05-036 and the § 314.5 statute. McCarthy stated Pacific's belief that ORA and the selected contractor have a conflict of interest in that they have taken positions adverse to PacBell. Blase asked the Commission to reevaluate the benefit of conducting any audit of PacBell at this time. Blase added that should the Commission find that an audit should be performed, responsibility for the audit should be transferred to the Telecommunications Division, and the contract with Overland should be cancelled.
