Also present was David Discher, Pacific General Counsel. Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. Pacific indicated that the draft arbitrator's report adopts MFS/Worldcom's (MFSW) position on reciprocal compensation; however, the rationale in the report does not support MFSW's position, which is that it should receive tandem routed compensation on every call it terminates regardless of the facilities or route used. Pacific stated that the draft report says MFSW is entitled to receive compensation for the tendem functions it provides Pacific on a reciprocal basis. Pacific explained that Pacific does not charge tandem routed rates on every call. Pacific indicated that the draft report also inappropriately extends its rationale to MFSW's incoming FEX calls, which, according to Pacific are not reciprocal and the only termination cost incurred by MFSW on incoming FEX calls is end office switching. Pacific also said that the draft was wrong to assume that MFSW's logical trunk group proposal will compensate Pacific for its costs to transport MFSW's incoming FEX calls. Pacific also explained that the draft report was confused on the issue of the price MFSW should pay for DA.
