Foster and Hoover explained Edison's opposition to the draft decision (DD) which would deny Edison's petition to modify D96-08-025. Foster and Hoover stated that the DD fails to recognize that the primary concerns discussed in D96-08-025 were resolved with the adopted ratemaking treatment, which aligned the interests of ratepayers and shareholders. Foster and Hoover further explained that the concern related to the uncertainties over how unbundling, performance-based ratemaking (PBR) and other aspects of the restructured industry will develop has also been resolved. Foster and Hoover added that the DD fails to recognize that the ratemaking and sales impacts are excluded from Edison's PBR. Foster and Hoover argued that the DD ignores the fact that the FPO decision found that Edison's proposed generic contracts are neither anticompetitive nor discriminatory and that it also ignores the unbundling decision that found that all direct access customers can take advantage of the FPOs. Foster and Hoover also pointed out that the DD would close rate options that existed prior to June 10, 1996, and that this would

violate AB1890 and would be inconsistent with D97-12-044. Foster and Hoover asked that the DD be rejected.

The letter stated that Pacific's ex parte letter mistakenly calculated the discounted price for an unbundled loop under SBC/Ameritech's proposed merger conditions to be \$8.78, when it should have been \$9.69. The letter explained that Pacific's ex parte failed to disclose all the restrictions on the availability of the discounted unbundled loop price under the SBC/Ameritiech's proposed merger conditions, which would render the proposed promotional discount for an unbundled loop virtually useless to potential competitors.

Summary: AUGMENTATION REQUIRED: On August 5, 1999, the Office of Ratepayer Advocates sent a letter (attached to the notice) to ALJ Minkin concerning the Motion of Independent Energy Producers Association, et al. for an Order approving Power Exchange-Based pricing pursuant to the one-time election of qualifying facilities (QFs) under Public Utilities Code § 390(c). Identical letters were also sent to Cmmr. Bilas, Cmmr. Duque, Cmmr. Neeper, Cmmr. Hyatt and Cmmr. Wood. The letter stated that the true-up mechanism proposed by Pacific Gas and Electric Company and Southern California Edison Company was a reasonable means to provide QFs with expedited relief while avoiding the danger of utility overpayments to QFs.

Summary: On August 6, 1999, Richard Severy, Director of Public Policy, MCI WorldCom, Inc. (MCI), met with Robert Lane, advisor to Cmmr. Hyatt, in San Francisco. Also present was William Harrelson, Senior Counsel for MCI. Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. MCI representatives stated that the latest proposed decision (PD) failed to ensure that unbundled network element (UNE) prices are appropriately priced to promote economic entry and allow for local competition for residential customers. MCI

representatives explained that the UNE prices that competitors would pay under the PD exceed the incumbent's current retail revenues, thus preventing competitive local exchange carriers from being able to compete. MCI representatives added that it is unreasonable to assume that new entrants can subsidize losses on local service through earnings they may achieve on other competitive services. MCI representatives urged the Commission to lower UNE prices to cost-based levels. MCI representatives urged the Commission to get geographically deaveraged loop rates and suggested that in the interim the Commission could apply a \$2.64 universal service offset for residential unbundled loops to eliminate a discrimination problem. Harrelson described errors in arriving at the unreasonably high 19% shared and common cost mark-up contained in the PD and recommended not to impose this mark-up on residential loops. MCI representatives also described the PD's failure to account for Yellow Pages revenues in setting UNE prices.
