The *Stakeholder Roundtable* is a key element of our ongoing effort to assure that the way the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) conducts business is fully aligned with evolving publicly-valued needs and expectations.

Federal and state utility deregulation, technological change, as well as other current issues with widespread impact including area code proliferation, local and long distance telephone competition, competition in electricity services, and the need for consumer education and protection in competitive industries. All of these make it imperative for the CPUC to continue to strive to address stakeholder and public needs in innovative and efficient ways.

The goal of the *Stakeholder Roundtable* is to hear your suggestions for specific, feasible, needed innovations at the CPUC with respect to, for instance, changes in processes, rules, ways of conducting business, and ways we interact and communicate with the public and others. We also seek ideas from our employees on how we can make the Commission a more fulfilling place to work.

8/25/99	I98-03-013	Order Instituting Investigation on the Commission's own motion, into whether existing standards and policies of the Commission regarding drinking water quality adequately protect the public health and safety with respect to contaminants such as Volatile Organic Compounds, Perchlorate, MTBEs, and whether those standards and policies are being uniformly complied with by Commission regulated utilities; compliance filing by utilities is due in 120 days from the date of the order.
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**Summary: THIS IS AN AUGMENTED NOTICE OF AN EX PARTE COMMUNICATION WHICH WAS FILED ON 8/23/99 AND APPEARED IN THE CALENDAR OF 8/26/99.** On August 19, 1999, Evelyn Elsesser, counsel , for AeroJet-General Corporation, Huffey Corporation, McDonnell Douglas Corporation, and Wynn Oil Company (the "Responding Parties"), met with Cmmr. Duque in San Francisco. Also present were: Tim Sullivan, advisor to Cmmr. Duque; Izetta Jackson for Legal Division;

and Fred Curry, Manager for Water Division Advisory Staff Program; Jane Lovell, counsel to Wynn Oil; and Dr. Elizabeth Anderson, expert witness for the Responding Parties. A Briefing Paper (attached to the notice) was handed out at the meeting. Responding Parties noted that drinking water standards and the water served to the public are safe. Responding Parties stated two key issues merit additional exploration: 1) whether they can further solidify conclusions regarding the implications of actual exceedance data on the safety of the water consumed; and 2) what if anything can be said about those periods of time for which there was no monitoring data regarding a particular chemical.

8/25/99            A98-05-038            Pacific Bell, for authority for pricing flexibility and to increase prices of certain operator services, to reduce the number of monthly directory assistance call allowances, and adjust prices for four centrex optional features

**Summary:** On August 20, 1999, Paul Stein, Staff Attorney, for The Utility Reform Network (TURN), met with Tim Sullivan, advisor to Cmmr. Duque, in San Francisco. Also present were: Thomas Long, Senior Telecommunications Attorney, and Terry Murray, consultant, for TURN. A handout (attached to the notice) which summarized TURN's objection was provided. TURN representatives discussed the proposed decision (PD) of ALJ Michael Galvin, which was mailed on August 17, 1999. TURN representatives explained that the PD should not be adopted for the following reasons: 1) PD's rejection of revenue neutrality would weaken the efficiency incentives built into the New Regulatory Framework (NRF) and allow Pacific Bell (PacBell) to raise profits by increasing rates for a noncompetitive services; 2) PD's recommended price increase to .50 cents for directory assistance (DA) violates basic principles of NRF regulation and would result in pricing gouging; 3) PD fails to give sufficient weight to the unprecedented amount and fervor of public opposition to the proposed price increases; 4) PD's analysis of the cost providing DA relies on unsupported claims by PacBell and ignores more credible evidence that DA costs are decreasing; 5) PD improperly ignores the impact on basic service resulting from the recommended reduction of the DA call allowance; and 6) PD ignores evidence that Centrex costs have gone down.
