The *Stakeholder Roundtable* is a key element of our ongoing effort to assure that the way the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) conducts business is fully aligned with evolving publicly-valued needs and expectations.

Federal and state utility deregulation, technological change, as well as other current issues with widespread impact including area code proliferation, local and long distance telephone competition, competition in electricity services, and the need for consumer education and protection in competitive industries. All of these make it imperative for the CPUC to continue to strive to address stakeholder and public needs in innovative and efficient ways.

The goal of the *Stakeholder Roundtable* is to hear your suggestions for specific, feasible, needed innovations at the CPUC with respect to, for instance, changes in processes, rules, ways of conducting business, and ways we interact and communicate with the public and others. We also seek ideas from our employees on how we can make the Commission a more fulfilling place to work.

Recently, the Commission issued its *Draft 1999 – 2000 CPUC Business Plan* for stakeholder review and comment (available at www.cpuc.ca.gov). Within it are ongoing process reform efforts, planned innovations in expanded electronic access to the CPUC, and additional planned streamlined procedures to benefit stakeholders and the public directly. The *Draft Business Plan* incorporates a set of eight good government initiatives I proposed this spring and the Directors' responses to an innovation survey conducted by the Governor's Office of Innovation in Government. These documents are available on the Commission website in association with this notice.

The *Stakeholder Roundtable* is intended to go a step further by enabling us to hear firsthand from electric, telephone, and gas utilities and providers, rail, water, transportation, and other regulated entities. We also seek input from the public, consumer groups, industry labor representatives, legislators, the Administration, other government agencies, employee advocacy groups and employee union representatives about innovations or improvements you think we should make to better serve public and stakeholder interests, and how we should begin to implement them expeditiously. Communication, both to and from the Commission, and access to Commission information, focusing on ease of use, availability of information or employees, and the timeliness and value of available information;

Electronic interfacing between the Commission and stakeholders, and e-business processes including the transferring information to and sharing of databases;

The development of expert systems or automated processes for repetitive business processes; and

Feedback mechanisms to continuously inform the Commission of a need to re-align its processes to address changing circumstances or enhanced technology.

Summary: On September 13, 1999, Bill Blasé, Vice President Regulatory, for Pacific Bell (Pacific), met with Cmmr. Bilas, in San Francisco. Also present were Lester Wong, advisor to Cmmr. Bilas; Ron Sawyer and David Discher, both for Pacific. Pacific said that it planned to make a written response to recent AT&T comments on UNE pricing, but wanted to respond briefly to some of the comments by AT&T. Pacific noted that AT&T improperly claims that residential UNE loop prices should be reduced below the adopted TELRIC costs to account for Yellow Page contributions. Pacific also noted that TELRIC costs that are the basis for the Commission's proposed UNE prices are substantially below Pacific's actual cost and imputing Yellow Page revenues only. Pacific stated that AT&T also complains about the universal service funding (USF) that Pacific receives and proposes that the Commission should adopt a USF credit for residential UNE loops. Pacific also stated that AT&T's proposal would allow it to misuse USF funding to serve customers in low cost urban areas rather than to encourage basic service in high cost rural areas. Pacific noted that if the mark-up is reduced for some UNEs it must be raised for others so that overall, UNE prices recover the total adopted TELRIC costs.

Summary: On September 13, 1999, William C. Harrelson, Senior Counsel, representing WorldCom Technologies, Inc. (MFSW), met with Cmmr. Wood, in San Francisco. Also present were: Norman Low, advisor for Cmmr. Wood; Eric A. Artman, Vice President – Industry Relations, for MFSW; Nicholas Selby and Karen Notsund, representing ICG; David Discher and Ron Sawyer, on behalf of Pacific Bell; and Karen Jones of the CPUC Telecommunications Division. Written materials was provided and attached to the notice. Harrelson urged that the Commission adopt the alternate to the Final Arbitrator's Report issued by Cmmr. Bilas. Harrelson asked that the Commission adopt the Alternate's

provision for reciprocal compensation for call termination service provided by MFSW at the same full tandem prices charged by Pacific Bell. Harrelson explained that the Federal Communications Commission has found that the incumbent local exchange carrier's cost of transport and termination should be used as a proxy for the competitive local exchange company's costs. Harrelson further described the architecture and functions provided by MFSW is similar to those provided by Pacific Bell's tandem switches.

Summary: On September 13, 1999, Karen Notsund, Senior Director – Government Affairs and Nick Selby, Undersigned Counsel, for ICG Telecom Group, Inc. (ICG), met with Kim Malcolm, advisor to Cmmr. Hyatt; Bob Lane, advisor to Cmmr. Hyatt; Cmmr. Wood; in three separate meetings. At the meeting with Cmmr. Wood also present were Norman Low, advisor to Cmmr. Wood; David Discher, Attorney, and Ron Sawyer, Case Manager, for Pacific Bell; William Harrleson and Eric Artman, attorneys for MFS WorldCom (MFSW); and on September 14, 1999, Notsund and Selby met with Cmmr. Neeper. Also participated in the meeting with Cmmr. Neeper were William Harrelson and Eric Artman, attorneys for MFS WorldCom. All meetings were held in San Francisco. Written materials were used and attached to the notice. Notsund and Selby discussed the portion of the Final Arbitrator's Report (FAR) that resolves Issue 83 and finds that MFSW is not entitled to claim compensation for the tandem switching and common transport functions that are performed by its fiber optic network. Notsund and Selby explained that ICG is concerned that the FAR's resolution of this issue would penalize efficiencies gained through deployment by competitive local exchange carriers (CLECs). Notsund and Selby stated ICG's position that the Commission should adopt the Cmmr. Bilas' Alternate Order. Notsund and Selby stated that CLEC networks provided the same call routing and transport functionality as the networks of incumbent local exchange carriers (ILECs), even though they do not require a second switch to terminate calls to end users. Notsund and Selby also stated the FAR reversed the determination in the DAR that MFSW should be able to claim compensation for performing tandem switching and common transport functions. Notsund and Selby stated that the Commission's best policy choice would be to allow the CLEC to retain the benefit of any efficiencies that it can provide to its end user customer. Notsund and Selby noted that Pacific Bell refuses to create such efficiencies for its end user customer by not permitting collocation in its central offices by ESPs and ISPs.

why competitive local exchange carriers (CLCs) should be paid reciprocal compensation at the full tandem charges Pacific Bell levies on CLCs. Harrelson and Artman noted that Pacific Bell's claim that all Internet Service Provider's (ISPs) collocate at MFSW's switches is not in the record of the case. Harrelson and Artman that it was a concerned Pacific Bell was treating the issue as an ISP issue, when reciprocal compensation should not vary based on the type of customer to whom calls are terminated. Harrelson noted that the parties in effect had the opportunity to comment on the alternate issued by Cmmr. Bilas, since it had been discussed in both the Draft and Final Arbitrator's Reports upon which all parties had an opportunity to comment.
