**Summary:** On October 8, 1999, Sara Steck Myers, Regulatory Counsel, for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Technologies (CEERT), met with Michelle Cooke, advisor to Cmmr. Duque, in San Francisco. Also present were v. John White, Executive Director, for CEERT, and Johanna Thomas, Hydropower Resources Specialist, for Environmental Defense Fund (EDF). Myers stated that both CEERT and EDF supported a Draft Decision (DD), but only as it accomplished two results: the issuance of an Order Instituting Investigation (OII), and the affirmation of the Commission's authority. Myers further stated that CEERT and EDF advocate a revision to the DD that would provide for the issuance of an OII to address issues related to both valuation and disposition of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) hydro assets. Myers stated that CEERT and EDF also supported a DD that retained affirmation of the finding in the February 1, 1999 Scoping Memo, under the existing law, PG&E may not transfer any generating assets without the express approval of the Commission. Myers noted that such a finding is fully supported by the law and was not changed by the Commission requiring PG&E to file the type of application envisioned by the DD. White and Thomas emphasized the critical nature of an OII. White stated that, if the Commission were to be the forum in which the valuation and

disposition of these assets were addressed, it was necessary that the Commission provide for an open, public fact-finding and hearing process, involving all stakeholders and affected stated interests and considering all issues raised by the sale of PG&E's hydro assets. Thomas stated that an effective means and forum to consider the environmental impacts of hydro divestiture and the present state of PG&E's hydro assets were needed. Thomas urged that all full environmental review of the Projects and their proposed sale was required pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act. To accomplish the task, Thomas suggested that the Commission should look to the State Water Resources Control Board, the Department of Fish and Game, and other affected state agencies for both expertise and resources to ensure and complete record and well-supported, sustainable findings were achieved.

Duque, Linda Serizawa and Norman Low, advisors to Cmmr. Wood; Fassil Fenikile, advisor to Cmmr. Nepper; and Lester Wong, advisor to Cmmr. Bilas, in San Francisco. Also present were: Robert Gnaizda, General Counsel & Policy Director, for Greenlining Institute; Viola Gonzales, Executive Director, of Latino Issues Forum; and Mark Savaga and Maria Andrade, counsel for Public Advocates representing National Council of La Raza, Filipino for Affirmative Action, Filipino Civil Rights Advocates, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Korean Youth and Community Center, California Rural Indian Health Board, Association of Mexican American Educators, California Association for Asian-Pacific Bilingual Education and California Association for Bilingual Education. Savage noted that the people at the meeting only represented a small number of the signatories to the Community Collaborative Agreement (CCA). Gonzales articulated that the CCA was a win-win for community based organizations and GTE/Bell Atlantic. McCallion noted that the CCA was approved at the highest levels within GTE and Bell Atlantic. McCallion also briefly discussed each of the CCA programs and the source of funds. Savage, Gonzales and Gnaizda each discussed that the progress of the CCA would be monitored by the parties and an annual report would be provided to the Commission. A copy of the Community Collaborative Agreement was provided and is attached to the notice.
