**Summary:** On October 18, 1999, Keith McCrea, Counsel for the California Industrial Group and California Manufacturers Association (CIG/CMA), engaged in two separate telephone communication with Michelle Cooke, advisor to Cmmr. Duque; and Dorothy Duda, advisor to Cmmr. Bilas. McCrea stated that the proposed decision (PD) ignored the benefits flowing from the FERC rate case settlements and that those benefits were acknowledged by both by the CPUC in its written comments to FERC and by the FERC orders. McCrea also stated that the stepdown benefits ascribed to the noncore customers by the PD failed to recognize that those benefits were a direct result in D.92-07-025 and are

substantially offset by the ITCS burden imposed on noncore customers. McCrea further stated that the PD was internally inconsistent in that it claimed that the FERC rate case settlements were blackboxes, but then proceeded to delve into the settlements to segregate the amount of surcharges attributable to the PG&E stepdowns.
