Subscription Notice for Draft Agenda Items

In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003, 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, CA 94102, or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items

only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

In addition, the Commission will make draft agenda items available for viewing and photocopying (at 20 cents per page) at the Commission’s Central Files Office (Room 2002), 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, and in the Los Angeles, San Diego, and the following field offices: El Centro, Eureka, Sacramento and San Bernardino. Since the agenda package will be mailed to these locations, it will be available at these locations a day or two after the distribution date. These locations will not receive agenda items that are not ready on the distribution date.

Summary: LATE FILED FOR THE 10/27/99 MEETING. On October 27, 1999, Barbara Snider, Counsel, and Jean Russell, Manager of Interconnection Services, for Citizens Telecommunications Company of California, (CTC-California), met with

Norman Low and Linda Serizawa, advisors to Cmmr. Woods; Tim Sullivan, advisor to Cmmr. Duque, in two separate meetings in San Francisco. On the next day, October 28, 1999, met with Lester Wong, advisor to Cmmr. Bilas; Robert Lane, advisor to Cmmr. Hyatt; and Fassil Fenikile, advisor to Cmmr. Neeper in three separate meetings, also in San Francisco. A handout materials were provided and attached to the notice. Snider and Russell summarized the conclusions in the Final Arbitrator's Report (FAR) which CTC-California has argued in the Statement concerning the FAR filed on October 22, 1999. Snider and Russell sated that the summary includes the assertion that it is legal error for the Commission to alter the status quo between the parties which is bill-and-keep before the FCC; the FAR to conclude that the Commission's preferred outcome of bill-and-keep is no longer a viable option; the FAR to conclude that Internet Service Provider-bound traffic must be included as part of a reciprocal compensation order; and for the FAR to find that because the Commission issued a decision stating that under PacWest's unusual form of rating and routing calls, end-users should be billed as a local call, that the same outcome must be adopted for inter-company compensation. Snider and Russell also addressed and corrected certain factual assertions made by PacWest in its earlier ex parte meetings regarding the issue of whether PacWest negotiated in good faith as well as discussed the diagrams PacWest submitted to the advisors in its meeting.
