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**Summary:** On December 6, 1999, Bruce Foster, Vice President Regulatory Affairs for Southern California Edison Company (SCE), wrote a letter (attached to the notice) to Cmmr. Bilas, Cmmr. Duque, Cmmr. Nepper, Cmmr. Wood, and Cmmr. Hyatt, in San Francisco. A copy of the letter was also sent to Commissioners' advisors Michelle Cooke, Kevin Coughlan, Dorothy Duda, David Gamson, Kim Malcom, Jullie Halligan, Anne Watson, and Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Andrea Biren.
