The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes

Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

In addition, the Commission will make draft agenda items available for viewing and photocopying (at 20 cents per page) at the Commission’s Central Files Office (Room 2002), 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, and in the Los Angeles, San Diego, and the following field offices: El Centro, Eureka, Sacramento and San Bernardino. CA-5 Res SX-27 – This Draft Resolution SX-27 will modify General Order No. 75-C “**REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE PROTECTION OF CROSSINGS AT GRADE OF ROADS, HIGHWAYS AND STREETS WITH RAILROADS IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA,**” by authorizing the inclusion of the use of light-emitting diode (LED) to Section 7.8. Summary: On December 15, 1999, Les Guliasi, Manager, Regulatory Relations, for Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), met with David Gamson, advisor to Cmmr. Neeper, and Bill Julian, advisor to Cmmr. Wood, in San Francisco. Also present were Dede Hapner, Vice President, Regulatory Relations; Lise Jordan, Attorney, and Bruce Smith, Director, Revenue Requirements, for PG&E. Written materials titled "Impact of the Proposed GRC Decision" was used and attached to the notice. Guliasi explained that the revenue requirement contained in the Proposed Decision (PD) does not provide PG&E with the funds necessary to maintain the levels of service and reliability that customers and the Commission expect. Jordan stated that for tree trimming and tree removal, PG&E requested \$137.8 million in total expenses, but the PD contains only \$77.2 million, a difference of \$60.6 million. Jordan also stated that the PD does not provide the \$72 million revenue requirement in infrastructure capital needed for reliability and new customer growth. Jordan explained that on the electric side, about half of the disallowance in the PD is associated with projects necessary to meet load growth and for capacity projects, while the other half is for reliability improvement investments. Jordan stated that on the gas side, the PD errs by reducing PG&E estimate for new business capital projects by an additional 10 percent. Guliasi stated that the PG&E has requested attrition for the years 2000 and 2001 in order to ensure that a sufficient level of revenues is authorized to cover the growth in rate base associated with customers and load growth.
