CA-5 Res SX-27 – This Draft Resolution SX-27 will modify General Order No. 75-C "REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE PROTECTION OF CROSSINGS AT GRADE OF ROADS, HIGHWAYS AND STREETS WITH RAILROADS IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA," by authorizing the inclusion of the use of light-emitting diode (LED) to Section 7.8. The following language would be added: Light Unit: The light unit shall produce highway crossing signal red light in accordance with the American Railway Engineering and Maintenance-of-Way Association (AREMA) Signal Manual, Part 3.2.35 – Recommended Design Criteria for Electric Light Unit for Highway-Rail Grade Crossing Signals including Light Emitting Arrays and Incandescent Lamps.

Summary: LATE FILED: On December 15, 1999, Robert Finkelstein, Staff Attorney, for The Utility Reform Network (TURN), met with Bill Julian, advisor to Cmmr. Wood, in San Francisco. TURN provided with the portion of TURN's prepared testimony addressing customer service (Exhibit 366) and the exhibit list. Finkelstein stated that since these materials are already part of the record in the proceeding, TURN has not attached to the notice.
