The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting.
