## Draft Resolution Extending Temporary Authority Of Passenger Stage Corporations To Adjust Fares Available For Public Review And Comment

A draft resolution (TL-18923) of the Rail Safety and Carriers Division that extends the temporary authority given to passenger stage corporations (PSCs) by Resolution TL-18904 to adjust their fares without specific Commission authorization will be on the March 16, 2000 Commission meeting agenda. The Commission may vote on this resolution at that time, or it may postpone a vote until later. When the Commission votes on Resolution TL-18923, it may adopt all or part of it as written, amend or modify it, or set it aside and prepare a different resolution.

Resolution TL-18904 authorized PSCs for a 180-day period to raise their fares as much as 15% above current fares or, for those carriers who had already been granted a zone of rate freedom (ZORF), 15% above the upper limit of the ZORF. The resolution was issued in response to the significant increases in fuel prices experienced by PSCs. Resolution TL-18923 extends this authorization for an additional 180 days.

Thomas Beach of the consulting firm, Crossborder Energy.

Mr. Beach indicated that Watson Cogeneration Company ("Watson") supports the PD's findings that the SoCalGas RLS tariff is driving electric generation load out of SoCalGas' service territory. To stop the resulting harm to ratepayers, the RLS tariff must be eliminated or reformed now, not in three years, as recommended in the PD. A cost-based peaking rate, such as that proposed by Watson in the BCAP, could be used to replace the current RLS tariff. The Commission has designed similar cost-based stand-by rates for electric utilities for the past two decades.
