In its complaint, Pacific Bell (Pacific) alleges that FirstWorld SoCal (U 5733) (FWSC), by virtue of its Letter of Agreement (LOA) with Orange City Mills Limited Partnership (Mills), is the exclusive provider of service at The Block at Orange (Block). Pacific also alleges that FWSC is the beneficiary of better terms of access to Block than Pacific was offered, in violation of Decision (D.) 98-10-058 and D.92-01-023.

We find that FWSC owns intrabuilding network cable (INC) pursuant to the LOA and in violation of D.98-10-058, D.92-01-023 and its tariffs. We order FWSC to renegotiate the LOA and cease ownership of INC within 60 days or face a fine of \$500 per day thereafter. We also find that FWSC owns inside wire at Block in violation of D.92-01-023. We order it to cease ownership of inside wire at Block within 60 days.
