Summary: On December 29, 1999, Patrick Gileau and Jonathan Bromson, attorneys representing the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA), met with Bill Julian, advisor to Cmmr. Wood, in San Francisco. A handout materials were provided and attached to the notice. Gileau addressed Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) contention that adoption of the Proposed Decision (PD) would lead to significant layoffs in areas affecting safety and reliability. Gileau also noted that ORA analyzed the tree trimming issue from three different perspectives: a four year average using two years of overspending and two years of underspending, a bottoms up approach and a top down approach. Gileau concluded by urging the Commission not to provide a gas distribution rate increase any greater than the 7.9% increase authorized by the PD. Bromson noted that PG&E was misrepresenting the PD as effectuating an electric rate decrease from the rates in effect

January 1, 1998, instead of an electric rate increase over the authorized amounts set in the 1996 GRC. Bromson also noted that if the Commission were inclined to grant PG&E a rate increase greater than that provided by the PD in order to maintain and improve reliability, as PG&E has argued since issuance of the PD, the Commission should adopt Quality Assurance Standards for PG&E.
