CA-5 Res SX-27 – This Draft Resolution SX-27 will modify General Order No. 75-C “**REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE PROTECTION OF CROSSINGS AT GRADE OF ROADS, HIGHWAYS AND STREETS WITH RAILROADS IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA,**” by authorizing the inclusion of the use of light-emitting diode (LED) to Section 7.8.
