Investigation 98-12-013 seeks information on the Pacific Gas and Electric Company power outage that occurred on December 8, 1998. The investigation will also consider whether the Commission should enter any orders to ensure that a similar outage does not occur again. Summary: On January 5, 2000, Richard B. Severy, Director, Public Policy, of MCI WorldCom, hand-delivered a copy of the written ex parte presentation (attached to the notice) to Kim Malcolm, advisor to Cmmr. Lynch, in San Francisco. On the same day, Sally McMahon, Vice President of Quality and Consumer Affairs, and Severy, of MCI WorldCom, met with Cmmr. Bilas, Lester Wong and Dorothy Duda, advisors to Cmmr. Bilas; Cmmr. Wood, Jonathan Lakritz and Linda Serizawa, advisors to Cmmr. Wood; Cmmr. Neeper, and Fassil Fenikile, advisor to Cmmr. Neeper, in three separate meetings in San Francisco. Written materials were provided and attached to the notice. During the meeting with Cmmr. Bilas, Cmmr. Wood, and Cmmr. Neeper, McMahon expressed MCI WorlCom's support for the consumer protection goals of the Draft Decision, but expressed concern with several of the ALJ's specific recommendations. McMahon pointed out that the proposed rules require written or oral customer authorization before a carrier can bill for charges, but that this requirement ignores per-use calling, such as dial-around, for which the customer's act of dialing constitutes authorization. McMahon urged the Commission to require carriers either to bill under their correct names, or to use the unique identifier if they do not. McMahon also pointed out that because the new consumer education plan and other legislatively-mandated disclosure requirements are intended to advise consumers of their rights to contest bills, it is not necessary to eliminate full service denial at this time.
