Investigation 98-12-013 seeks information on the Pacific Gas and Electric Company power outage that occurred on December 8, 1998. The investigation will also consider whether the Commission should enter any orders to ensure that a similar outage does not occur again. Parties have agreed to a series of workshops to consider recommendations for the prevention of a future such outage. Workshop 1 will be held on January 19 and 20, 2000. CA-5 Res SX-27 – This Draft Resolution SX-27 will modify General Order No. 75-C “**REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE PROTECTION OF CROSSINGS AT GRADE OF ROADS, HIGHWAYS AND STREETS WITH RAILROADS IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA,**” by authorizing the inclusion of the use of light-emitting diode (LED) to Section 7.8. The following language would be added: *Light Unit: The light unit shall produce highway crossing signal red light in accordance with the American Railway Engineering and Maintenance-of-Way Association (AREMA) Signal Manual, Part 3.2.35 – Recommended Design Criteria for Electric Light Unit for Highway-Rail Grade Crossing Signals including Light Emitting Arrays and Incandescent Lamps.*

ORA representatives stated that the Pacific Bell audit would be the first in more than ten years and would provide cost information relevant to proceedings in which rates, prices of services, or value of assets are at issue. ORA representatives also stated that the audit scope in the Request of Proposal (RFP) complies with the instruction of the Executive Director as reflected in the September 18, 1998, a letter from the Executive Director to ORA's Director, which ORA provided and attached to the notice
