Investigation 98-12-013 seeks information on the Pacific Gas and Electric Company power outage that occurred on December 8, 1998. The investigation will also consider whether the Commission should enter any orders to ensure that a similar outage does not occur again. Parties have agreed to a series of workshops to consider recommendations for the prevention of a future such outage. Workshop 1 will be held on January 19 and 20, 2000. It will address hardware issues, plus recovery strategies and procedures for response. Workshop 2 will address incident reporting and corrective actions, plus safety and reliability issues.
