Summary: On February 25, 2000 @ 2:00 p.m., at the CPUC in San Francisco, the following person(s) met with Kim Malcolm, Advisor to Commissioner Lynch, to wit: Greg Blue of Dynergy, Inc., Robert Weisenmiller of MRW & Associates and Brian Cragg, Esq., for Electric Generator Alliance (EGA). Written materials used during the meeting consisted of a copy of the slides that accompanied the presentation of Kellan Fluckiger of the California ISO at the Commission's Roundtable in San Diego on January 25, 2000 and the table of contents and executive summary of the UCAN report entitled "The Coming Electric Shock," copies of all of which are attached.

Mr. Cragg expressed the support of EGA for the Proposed Decision on the issue of the single gas transportation rate for electric generators. Mr. Weisenmiller observed that waiting for FERC or the ISO to implement pricing initiatives could be futile, but the Sepra-wide rate could be put into place immediately and was entirely under the Commission's control. The EGA representatives explained that the Sempra-wide rate does not disadvantage generators located in SoCalGas territory. Mr. Blue stated that Dynergy supported the Sempra-wide rate because of the competitive and efficiency improvements it offered. Both TURN and UCAN support the single EG rate.
