WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, having requested permission by letter of August 29, 1950 to occupy both sides of Orcutt Road just southwest of San Luis Obispo, with Class "H" lines, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission such occupancy would constitute a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: Other than said occupancy would not at this time be economically justifiable and said occupancy is not presently detrimental to the requirements of other utilities in the same area,

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted, and good cause appearing

IT IS ORDERED that permission be and is hereby granted Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy both sides of Groutt Road between its San Luis Obispo Substation and Steele Road, Just southwest of San Luis Obispo, with Class "H" lines substantially in accordance with the sketch attached to its letter of request dated August 29, 1950, provided that if future circumstances require the use of any space so appropriated for other utility facilities, Pacific Gas and Electric Company will promotly cooperate in effecting such reconstruction as may be necessary equitably to resolve conflicting requirements.

The Secretary is directed to cause appropriate notice to be given to said utility of the granting of this authorization.
