SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Changes in Tariff Schedules which will Result in an Offering of Lesser Service.

WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY by Advice No. 228, filed September 21, 1950, having requested authority to make revisions in its tariff schedules effective on thirty days' notice as designated in Schedule LS-1 set forth on Revised Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 2532-E and 2533-E, relating to flat rate, complete service, street and highway lighting, which revisions will result in the withdrawal of offer to serve street lighting with 800 lumen and 25,000 lumen series lamps and 25 watt and 75 watt multiple lamps, none of which are presently being supplied, and said revisions requiring authorization by the Commission; and

It appearing that the withdrawal of the offering of such service is justified; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY FOUND that such increased rates or charges as may result from the above revisions in the tariff schedules are justified; and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that authority be granted under Section 63(a) of the Public Utilities Act to make the above described sheets effective on October 21, 1950.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the tariff sheets issued in accordance with the Order herein contained shall be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution No. E-730 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
