SUBJECT: Approval of Common Neutral Conductor Tag in Accordance with Rule 59.3-F of General Order No. 95.

WHEREAS: THE CALIFORNIA OREGON POWER COMPANY having requested approval by letter of October 2, 1950 of an aluminum tag to be used to designate the common neutral conductor on the proposed common neutral system in Montague, Siskiyou County, and such approval having been granted by Resolution No. E-729, dated October 10, 1950, and

WHEREAS: The California Oregon Power Company, because of cost, has requested permission to use a different tag as shown on its drawing dated September 29, 1950, as revised October 5, 1950, and submitted with its letter of October 6, 1950, and it appearing that tags of the revised design would meet the requirements and intent of Rule 59.3-F of General Order No. 95, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that approval be and hereby is granted The California Oregon Power Company to use copper tags as shown by its drawing as revised October 5, 1950, a copy of which is attached to its letter of request dated October 6, 1950 for designating the common neutral conductor on the proposed common neutral system in Montague. Siskiyou County.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the approval of aluminum tags of prior design granted by Resolution No. E-729, dated October 10, 1950, is hereby rescinded.

The Secretary is directed to cause appropriate notice to be given said utility of the granting of such approval.
