WHEREAS: SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY, having requested by letter of November 14, 1950, permission to occupy both sides of Woodruff Avenue between Arbor Road and Centralia for a distance of approximately 838 feet, all in Los Angeles County, with Class "H" Lines, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission such occupancy would constitute a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: Other than said occupancy would not at this time be economically justifiable and said occupancy is not presently detrimental to the requirements of other utilities in the same area,

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted, and good cause appearing

IT IS ORDERED that permission be and is hereby granted Southern California Edison Company to occupy both sides of Woodruff Avenue between Arbor Road and Centralia, Los Angeles County, substantially in accordance with the sketch attached to its letter of request dated November 14, 1950; provided that if future circumstances require the use of any space so appropriated for other utility facilities, Southern California Edison Company will promptly cooperate in effecting such reconstruction as may be necessary equitably to resolve conflicting requirements.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given said utility of the granting of this authorization.
