SUBJECT: Permission to Deviate from Rule 54.8-B4a of General Order No. 95 with Respect to the 8-foot Vertical Clearance of a Service Drop Over a Commercial Building.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY having requested permission by letter of February 20, 1951 to install service drop conductors to the Salinas Union High School District Administration Building at a vertical clearance of less than 8 feet over the roof, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission such construction would constitute a violation of Rule 54.8-B4a of General Order No. 95, and


WHEREAS: It appears that safety to workmen and the public will not be lessened by such an installation and that the requested permission should be granted, and good cause appearing

IT IS ORDERED that permission be and is hereby granted Pacific Gas and Electric Company to install service drop conductors to the Salinas Union High School District Administration Building at a vertical clearance of less than 8 feet over the roof, provided that the service attachment structure on the Administration Building is not more than 18 inches from the front face of the building wall facing the service main, and further provided that the required ground clearances are obtained for the service drop conductors.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given said utility of the granting of this authorization.
