SUBJECT: Cancellation of Permission to Deviate from Rule 74.4-B1 of General Order No. 95 and Section 1 of General Order No. 26-C.

WHEREAS: It appearing that The Oakland Terminal Railway and Key System Transit Lines were authorized by Resolution No. E-567, dated April 22, 1947, to deviate from the provisions of Rule 74.4-B1 of General Order No. 95 and Section 1 of General Order No. 26-C to the extent that they might construct, maintain, and operate an overhead trolley line above a proposed spur track on the west side of Poplar Street between 14th and 16th Streets in the City of Oakland at clearances less than as specified in Section 1 of General Order No. 26-C and Rule 74.4-B1 of General Order No. 95; and

It appearing that said companies no longer propose to build such spur track as indicated by letter of March 8, 1951 and by telephone conversation on March 14, 1951,

IT IS FOUND that application of the deviation authorized by said Resolution No. E-567 is unwarranted and that said resolution should be cancelled, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the permission to deviate from the provisions of Rule 74.4-B1 of General Order No. 95 and Section 1 of General Order No. 26-C authorized by Resolution No. E-567 is annulled and such resolution is hereby cancelled.

The secretary is directed to cause appropriate notice to be given The Oakland Terminal Railway and Key System Transit Lines of the cancellation of the authority granted by said Resolution No. E-567.
