RETURN TO ELECTRIC DIVISION

SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy Both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY having requested, by letter of November 7, 1951, permission to occupy both sides of 11th Avenue, with Class "H" lines for a distance of about 3400 feet north of Kent Avenue, 8 miles south of Hanford in Kings County, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission such occupancy constitutes a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: Other than said occupancy would not at this time be economically justified and said occupancy is not presently detrimental to the requirements of other utilities in the same area.

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be and is hereby granted Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy both sides of 11th Avenue, 8 miles south of Hanford, in Kings County, substantially in accordance with the sketch included with its letter of November 7, 1951; provided that if future circumstances require the use for other utility facilities, of any space so appropriated, Pacific Gas and Electric Company will promptly cooperate in effecting such reconstruction as may be necessary equitably to resolve conflicting requirements.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given said utility of the granting of this authorization.
