SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy Both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY having requested by letter of April 28, 1952, permission to occupy both sides of 50th Avenue with Class "H" lines for a distance of about 250 feet north of the intersection of 50th Avenue with the East Shore Freeway in Oakland and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission such occupancy constitutes a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is in accordance with this construction, and

WHEREAS: Pacific Gas and Electric Company proposes to construct two additional 12 kv circuits on a line of poles to be located on the east side of 50th Avenue in order to provide for growth of industrial load to the south and east of 50th Avenue.

IT IS FOUND that the required permission should be granted, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be and hereby is granted Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy both sides of 50th Avenue with Class "H" lines for a distance of 250 feet, more or less, north of the intersection of 50th Avenue with the East Shore Freeway in Oakland, Alameda County, substantially in accordance with the sketch included in its letter of April 28, 1952.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given said utility of the granting of this authorization.
