SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY having requested by letter of June 18, 1952, permission to occupy both sides of Second Street, San Rafael, Marin County, with Class "H" lines, for a distance of approximately 720 feet, commencing at Landro Street and extending southerly to the intersection of Second Street with Francisco Boulevard, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission such occupancy constitutes a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has expressed its accord with the proposed construction, and

WHEREAS: Pacific proposes reconstruction along Second Street in order to reduce the hazard of service interruption to large portions of the communities of San Rafael, Ross, Kentfield, San Anselmo and Fairfax,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be and it is hereby granted Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy both sides of Second Street with Class "H" lines, commencing at Landro Street and extending southerly to the intersection of Second Street with Francisco Boulevard, a distance of approximately 720 feet, in San Rafael, Marin County, substantially in accordance with the sketch included in its letter of June 18, 1952.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given said utility of the granting of this authorization.
