SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY having requested by letter of July 16, 1952, permission to occupy both sides of Sir Francis Drake Boulevard, Fairfax, Marin County, with Class "H" lines for a distance of approximately 2,000 feet, commencing at Pastori Avenue and extending westerly to Pacheco Street, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission such occupancy constitutes a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has expressed its accord with the proposed construction.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be and it is hereby granted Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy both sides of Sir Francis Drake Boulevard with Class "H" lines for approximately 2,000 feet between the streets of Pastori and Pacheco in Fairfax, Marin County, substantially in accordance with the sketch included in its letter of July 16, 1952.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given said utility of the granting of this authorization.
