SUBJECT: Permission to Support Temporary Decorative Equipment on Electric Trolley Facilities.

WHEREAS: THE TABERT CORPORATION of 3443 South Hill Street, Los Angeles, having requested permission by letter received November 6, 1952 to install and maintain decorative garlands, lighting and other decorative fixtures on the trolley facilities along Main Street, Santa Ana, during the holiday season, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission said installation would constitute a violation of Rule 78.3-C of General Order No. 95.

IT IS FOUND that the requested permission should be granted, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HERMEY ORDERED that The Tabery Corporation, of Los Angeles, be and is hereby authorized to install and maintain temporary decorative garlands and other decorating fixtures from, and supported by, auxiliary span wires attached to poles supporting trolley contact conductors in Santa Ana as requested by letter received November 6, 1952, and in accordance with Rule 78.3-C of General Order No. 95. This authorization shall terminate on January 10, 1953 and shall not be construed as permitting any use of utility facilities for such temporary construction without consent of all parties having ownership in the poles or facilities to which attachment may be made.

The secretary is directed to cause appropriate notice to be given The Tabery Corporation and Pacific Electric Railway Company of the granting of this authorization.
