SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy Both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY having requested by letter of January 8, 1953 permission to occupy with Class "H" lines both sides of King Road, in Santa Clara County, southerly from Mabury Substation to McKee Road a distance of approximately 1,500 feet, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission this occupancy would constitute a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has expressed its accord with the proposed construction on jointly used poles on the easterly side of King Road with the expectation that Pacific Gas and Electric Company will provide fault relays in the proposed 12 kv circuit which will insure prompt de-energizing in the event of an accidental contact with the communication circuits,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be granted Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy both sides of King Road, in Santa Clara County, southerly from Mabury Substation to McKee Road a distance of approximately 1,500 feet, substantially in accordance with the sketch included with its letter of January 8, 1953. It is expected that the parties involved will cooperate with respect to the coordination of the protective equipment on both power and communication circuits to minimize the effect of accidental contact.

The Secretary is hereby directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the Pacific Gas and Electric Company and a copy to The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company.
