SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Revisions in Tariff Schedules on Less than Statutory Notice which May Result in an Increase in Rates or Charges.

WHEREAS: CALIFORNIA ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, by Advice No. 47 and Supplement filed February 17, 1953 and February 20, 1953, respectively, having requested authority under Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to make revisions in its tariff schedules, effective on thirty (30) days' notice; namely, on March 19, 1953, as designated on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 796-E, 797-E, 799-E, 801-E, 802-E, 804-E, 805-E, 806-E, 808-E, 809-E, 812-E to 817-E, 820-E, 826-E, 829-E, and 830-E, relating to certain schedules and rules and regulations as indicated in said advice letter, which revisions may result in increased rates or charges; and having requested authority, under Section 455 of the Public Utilities Code to make revisions in its Table of Contents as designated on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 840-E and 841-E effective on less than thirty (30) days' notice; namely, on March 19, 1953; and

It appearing that such increased rates or charges as may result from the above revisions are justified; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 454 and 455 of the Public Utilities Code to make the above described sheets effective on March 19, 1953.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the above described tariff sheets shall be marked to show that they were issued under Resolution No. E-799 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
