WHEREAS: Tide Water Associated Oil Company having requested by letter of September 30, 1953, permission to install, on wood crossarms on wood poles, risers in metal conduit without protective covering, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission such construction would be a violation of Rule 54.6E of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: It appears that safety to workmen and the public will not be lessened by risers so installed provided certain conditions are met and that the requested permission should be granted, and good cause appearing

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be and is hereby granted to Tide Water Associated Oil Company to install risers in metal conduit without protective covering under the following provisions:

- (1) All grounded metal pipe and mounting devices will by in excess of 24 inches from the center line of the pole.
- (2) There is only one circuit on the pole consisting of not more than two branches operated in parallel,
- (3) The circuit voltage is in excess of 7500 volts.
- (4) All energized conductors are above the level of the highest exposed grounded surface or part on the pole.
- (5) The risers are not within the climbing and working spaces on the pole, and
- (6) This permission is to apply to the specific locations shown on the sketch enclosed with the company's letter of request, dated September 30, 1953.

The Secretary is directed to cause appropriate notice to be given said company of the granting of this permission.
