SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Supplemental Contract Filed Under  
Section X, Paragraph A, of General Order No. 96

WHEREAS: THE CALIFORNIA OREGON POWER COMPANY, having submitted for filing and having requested authorization for a supplemental agreement with The McCloud River Lumber Company dated February 8, 1954 which agreement modifies a contract between the company and McCloud dated June 14, 1935 and authorized by this Commission's Resolution No. E-782.

WHEREAS: Such modification of February 8, 1954 provides for an increase in the energy rate from 7.5 mills to 8.7 mills, and minimum payments from \$4,200 per year to \$4,900 per year. This modification also provides for the elimination of the nonpreference clause of the original contract thereby granting equal rights to McCloud with other customers served under filed tariffs in case of a power shortage. The remaining provisions as set forth in said contract dated June 14, 1935, shall continue in full force and effect.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that The California Oregon Power Company be authorized under Section 532 of the Public Utilities Code to carry out the provisions of said supplemental agreement with the terms thereof.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the agreement hereinbefore authorized be marked to show that it was authorized under Resolution No. E-837 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.

The Secretary is directed to cause a certified copy of this resolution to be mailed to The California Oregon Power Company.
