SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Revisions in Tariff Schedules on Less Than Statutory Notice.

WHEREAS: SACRAMENTO RIVER FARMS, LTD., by Advice No. 11 filed April 29, 1954, having requested authority to make revisions in its tariff schedules as designated in Cal. P.U.C. Sheet No. 61-E, relating to General Service-Demand Metered Schedule A-2, an original sheet filing covering a type of service not previously offered, and Cal. P.U.C. Sheet No. 62-E, Table of Contents, effective on less than 30 days' notice, namely, on January 1, 1954, which said revision requires authorization by the Commission under Section 491 of the Public Utilities Code, and

WHEREAS: Sacramento River Farms, Ltd., in support of its request for such authorization, has submitted evidence supporting the desirability and justification for inclusion in its tariff schedules the new tariff schedule necessary to serve the combined power and lighting load of Mills Orchard Company. The development of this tariff has been under consideration by the Commission's staff and the rate level was found appropriate to customers in that system who desire combined power and lighting loads, and

It appearing that said schedule should be made effective on less than statutory notice and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that authority be granted under Section 491 of the Public Utilities Code to make the above sheets effective on January 1, 1954.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the tariff sheets issued in accordance with the order herein contained shall be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution No. E-846 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
