R E S O L U T I O N

SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy Both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, having requested by letter of June 25, 1954, permission to occupy with Class "H" lines both sides of Rengstorff Avenue for a distance of 4,330 feet and Thompson Road for a distance of 940 feet; both thoroughfares being near Mountain View in Santa Clara County, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission this occupancy would constitute a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and,

WHEREAS: The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has by letter of June 17, 1954 expressed approval of the proposed occupancy of both sides of the thoroughfare,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be granted to Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy with Class "H" circuits both sides of Rengstorff Avenue from a point 302 feet south of San Ramon Street northerly to Charleston Road a distance of approximately 4,330 feet, and Thompson Road from a point 325 feet south of Alvin Street northerly to the junction of an unnamed road a distance of approximately 940 feet. The construction to be substantially the same as shown on the plan map submitted with its request of June 25, 1954.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the granting of this authorization.
