SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy Both Sides of Thoroughfare with Class "H" Lines

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, having requested by letter of June 25, 1954, permission to occupy with Class "H" lines both sides of portions of Redwood Avenue, Oak Street and Compton Road in Eureka, Humboldt County for a total distance of 1,700 feet, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission this occupancy would constitute a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has by letter of June 11, 1954 to the Pacific Gas and Electric Company expressed approval of the proposed occupancy of both sides of the thoroughfares,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be granted to Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy with Class "H" circuits both sides of Redwood Avenue from Walnut Street east to a point 200 feet east of Cedar Street, a distance of approximately 600 feet, and on Oak Street from E Street east to H Street, a distance of approximately 925 feet, thence easterly along Compton Road for a distance of 175 feet. The construction to be substantially the same as shown on plan maps marked GMO 117317, Sheets 1 and 2 submitted with its request of June 25, 1954.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the granting of this authorization.
