SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Revisions in Tariff Schedules Which
May Result in Increased Rates or Charges and Authorizing

Deviations from Filed Tariff Schedules.

WHEREAS: Southern California Edison Company, by Advice No. 244, filed November 3, 1954, having requested authority to make revisions in its tariff schedules on 30 days' notice as designated in Schedule H, Heating and Power, set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheet No. 2643, which said revisions may result in more restrictive conditions or increases in charges, and will permit service to existing customers served under this schedule at filed rates but under conditions differing from the revised schedule, requiring authorization from the Commission; and

It appearing that such conditions or charges as may result from the above revisions are justified; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 454 and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make Cal. P.U.C. Sheet No. 2643 effective on statutory notice, namely on December 3, 1954, and to render service on a deviation basis at filed rates and under conditions as detailed in the above advice letter.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the tariff sheets issued in accordance with the order herein contained shall be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution No. E-869 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
