SUBJECT: Permission to Occupy Both Sides of Thoroughfare  
with Class "H" Lines

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY having requested by letter of December 30, 1954, permission to occupy with Class "H" circuits, in Salinas, both sides of Front Street between Lake and East Market Streets, a distance of 600 feet, and East Market Street between Front and Griffin Streets, a distance of 1,400 feet, and Griffin Street between Front and East Alisal Streets, a distance of 2,125 feet, and

WHEREAS: In the absence of such permission this occupancy constitutes a violation of Rule 31.3 of General Order No. 95, and

WHEREAS: The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has by letter of October 22, 1954 indicated it has no objection to such occupancy,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: that permission be granted to Pacific Gas and Electric Company to occupy with Class "H" circuits, in Salinas, both sides of Front Street between Lake and East Market Streets a distance of 600 feet, and East Market Street between Front and Griffin Streets, a distance of 1,400 feet, and griffin Street between Front and East Alisal Streets, a distance of 2,125 feet, substantially as shown on the plan map marked Drawing Number 4846-B Change 1, submitted with its request of December 30, 1954.

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given the Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the granting of this authorization.
