SUBJECT: Order Authorizing Revisions in Tariff Schedules Which May Result in Increased Rates or Charges and Authorizing Deviations From Filed Tariff Schedules on Less Than Statutory Notice
WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Advice No. 128-E, filed February 21, 1955 having requested authority to make revisions in its tariff schedules as designated in Schedule PA-6, Agricultural Power, set forth on Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 2459 to 2462-E, inclusive, to become effective on February 25, 1955, which is less than 30 days' notice, which said revisions may result in increased charges of a minor nature and will result in increased charges to four existing customers, named on the above advice letter, which customers will be served under filed rates but under conditions differing from the revised schedules, requiring authorization from the Commission; and

It appearing that such conditions or charges as may result from the above revisions are justified; therefore, good cause appearing.

IT IS HEREEY ORDERED that authority be granted under Sections 454, 491, and 532 of the Public Utilities Code to make Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 2459-E to 2462-E, inclusive, effective on February 25, 1955 and to render service on a deviation basis to the four customers at filed rates and under conditions detailed in the above advice letter.

IT IS HEMEST FORTHER ORDERED that the tariff sheets issued in accordance with the order herein contained shall be marked to show that such sheets were issued under Resolution Nc. E-879 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California.
