R E S O L U T I O N

RETURN TO ELECTRIC SECTION

SUBJECT: Order Extending Time of Permitted Deviation from Provisions of Rule 58.4-C of General Order No. 95--Pacific Gas and Electric Company.

WHEREAS: PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, by Resolution No. E-873, issued January 18, 1955, was granted authority to deviate from the provisions of Rule 58.4-C of General Order No. 95 for a period of time ending December 31, 1955, and

WHEREAS: The Commission now has before it for decision the matter of the utility's Fifth Supplemental Application in Application No. 25309, submitted November 1, 1955, seeking permanent authority to so deviate, and

WHEREAS: Decision on said Fifth Supplemental Application may not be rendered and made effective on or before December 31, 1955, thus rendering the status of applicant's installations made in accordance with the aforesaid Resolution No. E-873 uncertain, and

IT APPEARING that an extension of the period of time for the now permitted deviation is reasonable and good cause appearing; therefore,


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that ordering paragraph No. 4 of Resolution No. E-873 be and it is modified to read as follows:

"4. The authority herein granted shall expire March 31, 1956."

The Secretary is hereby directed to cause appropriate notice to be given Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the foregoing provisions of this resolution.
